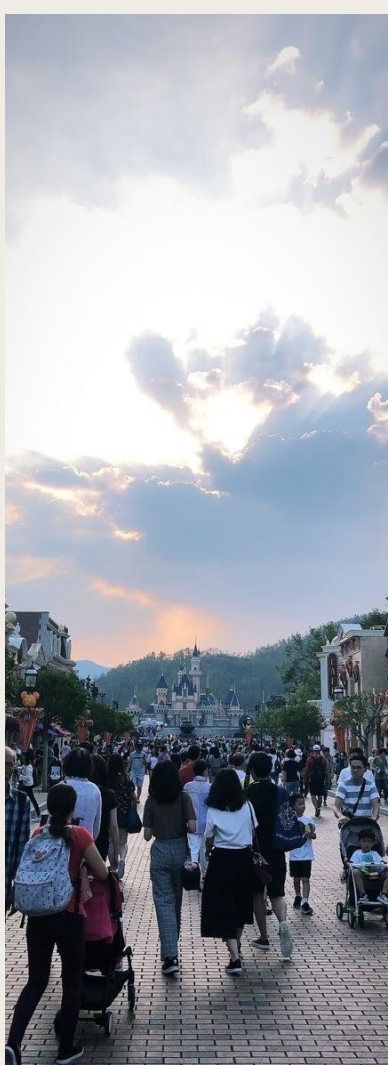

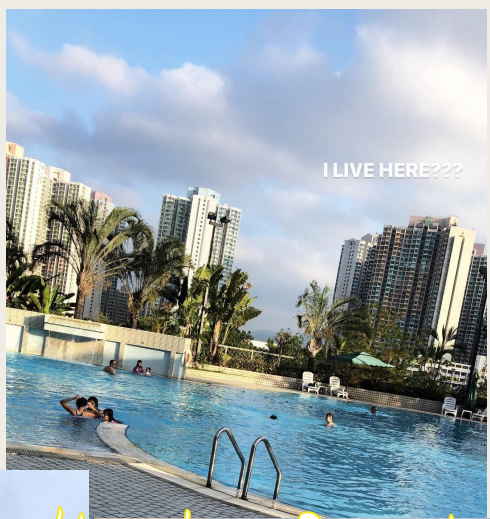

I felt very at home in Hong Kong because it reminded me of New York City



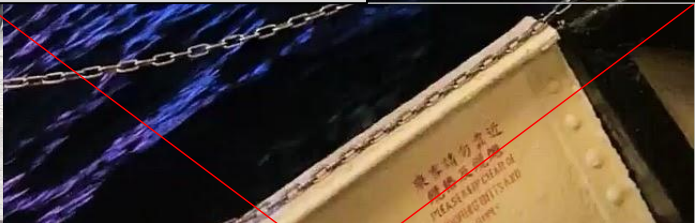
I came to work for Hong Kong Disneyland, so Lantau Island became my home.

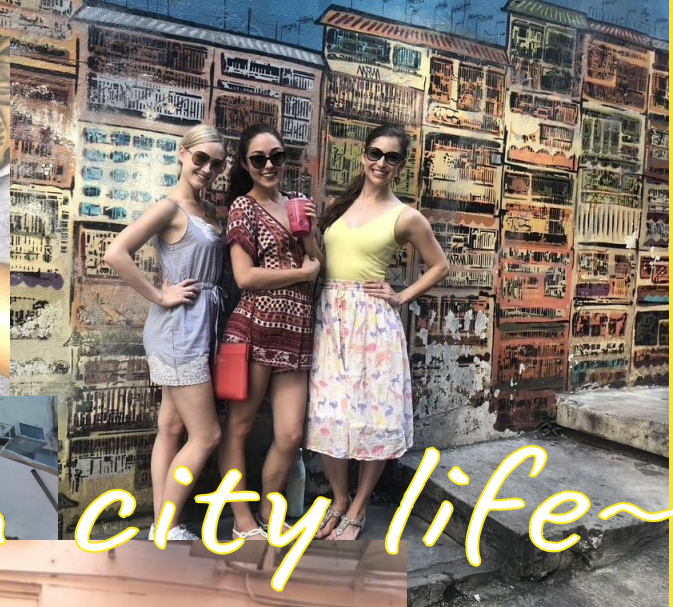
